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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

The bill creates a 27-member Alaska Invasive Species Council (Council) to facilitate cooperation between local, tribal, state, and federal governments and other organizations and individuals to respond to invasive species. It provides for a variety of tactics and strategies that state agencies might use in such response. It requires the Alaska Department of Fish & Game (ADF&G) to classify all non-native biological material existing in the state, including plants, animals, microbes, etc., as either prohibited, regulated, or approved.
The bill grants ADF&G broad powers to restrict access to lands and waters to limit or prevent potential cross-contamination of invasive species. The Department of Natural Resources Division of Mining, Land and Water (DMLW) has statutory authority for managing access to land and water under Title 38 (Lands Act), Title 46.15 (Water Use Act) and other titles. This factor makes it not possible to determine whether DMLW's responsibilities would be reduced, expanded, or continue unchanged; therefore, the division submits an indeterminant fiscal note.

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
