Analysis

This bill explicitly allows shared ownership of milk-producing animals and the sharing of raw milk or a raw milk product produced by an owner among those same owners.
The bill prohibits the Department from restricting or imposing requirements on the sharing or transfer of raw milk or raw milk products between co-owners, and provides a definition of "raw milk" and "raw milk product". There would be no regulatory oversight, testing, or inspections required of the Department under this proposed legislation.
Food borne illness outbreaks related to raw milk distributed through herd share agreements are an existing risk. The Department remains prepared to assist the Department of Health and Social Services with investigating these outbreaks with current resources.
