FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

**STATE OF ALASKA
2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION****Analysis**

Passage of this legislation would have not have any additional fiscal impact on the division related to conducting the primary election. The division receives an appropriation to conduct the primary election. This appropriation will be used to cover costs, if needed, of conducting a primary election by mail.

There would be costs associated with conducted a statewide special election. It is assumed the funding required to conduct such election would be handled in other legislation.

This legislation provides authorization for the division to promulgate emergency regulations, if needed, to implement by mail voting at the statewide level. The division anticipates needing the regulations in effect by 7/1/2020.
