Ethics: Potential Financial Benefits

Answer: Yes.

Board of Fish decisions are made that could provide for a potential financial benefit for me and family members. This is accomplished primarily through allocation and changes in management plans between user groups i.e. a particular fishery. It is important to note that this outcome can and does occur with or without the conflicted board member's participation in the deliberation process. The proposals presented to the board can be very complex and there are many sources of relevant information to be considered by each member before a final decision is made.

In an effort to restrict a board members abuse of power, members must provide an ethics statement at the beginning of each regulatory meeting stating whether or not they may have a conflict with the materials before them, concerning financial benefits to family members – first degree of kinship. Then the chairman makes the decision as to whether or not the board member may participate in the matters before the board. Any member may object to the chair's determination. Then the board votes on whether said member may or may not participate on the proposals before the board at said meeting.

Professional Experience Summary

Mr. Jensen has over fifty years of mariner experience in Alaska as a commercial fisherman, fishing vessel owner and hired captain of larger fishing vessels. During his career he has participated in over twenty individual, commercial fisheries prosecuted in the coastal regions of Alaska: Southeast Alaska, Gulf of Alaska, Prince William Sound, Cook Inlet, Alaska Peninsula, the Bering Sea/Aleutians, Bristol Bay and Norton Sound.

Mr. Jensen's commercial fishing career began in 1965, while long-lining for halibut in the Gulf of Alaska and summer salmon seining. Fishing opportunities quickly expanded from halibut and salmon in Southeast, to the empire building years of red king crab fishing in the Bering Sea during the late 1960's - '70's. In 1972, he purchased his first of five fishing vessels and began gillnetting for salmon in SE Alaska. As the business grew and new fishing prospects emerged; he invested and expanded his participation in a variety of fisheries and gear types. In 1979, he contracted the custom design and assisted in the construction of a 36' fishing vessel. In 1981, a 32' vessel was built and he purchased a permit for Bristol Bay salmon gillnetting. BB herring seining/roe on kelp, followed. In 1989, he contracted and assisted in the building of a 46' vessel; built for the SE crab fisheries, seining and long-lining. Downsizing in 2003, a 32' vessel was fished for SE Dungeness crab and halibut. From 2005-2016, he was employed as a captain of larger, tender vessels working in various fishing areas of Alaska.

In operation since 2010, Mr. Jensen owns a seasonal, self-guided skiff rental business in Petersburg; providing boating adventures for sport fishing & hunting, camping, whale-watching and glacier viewing. The fleet consists of 12 skiffs, 18'-22'; custom outfitted for each trip and recreational activity.

A serious interest in the fisheries regulatory process began while serving as secretary for the Petersburg Fisherman's Union for halibut fishers, a member of a Regional Fisheries advisory group initiated by the Hammond administration, and a member of the Petersburg Fish & Game Advisory Committee, 1974-80. Mr. Jensen was an active member of the Petersburg Vessel Owners Association and the Red King and Tanner Crab Task Force. In 2002, he accepted an appointment to the Alaska Board of Fisheries and has now served for six consecutive terms, 2002-2020. He has served as the Chairman of the Board for three years and vice-chair for two years.

Annually, as assigned, he works with various committees associated with the Board of Fish:

- Board of Fish/Bd. of Game

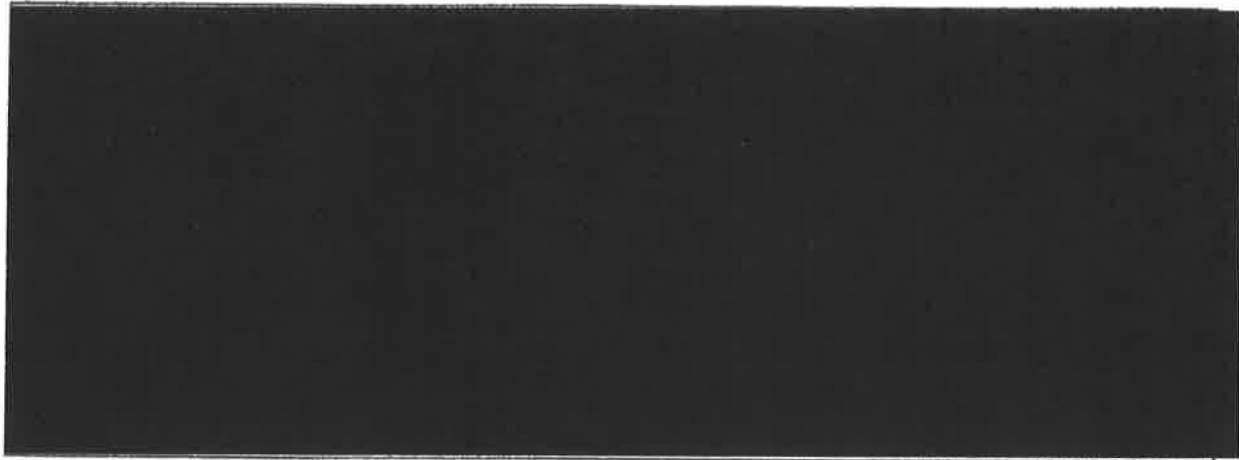
