FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

The proposed bill amends Title 33 and Title 47 to bring Alaska into compliance with the federal Juvenile Justice Reform Act. The bill proposes specific court findings to allow non-delinquent minors to be held temporarily in secure juvenile facilities and requires that minors waived to adult court are held in secure juvenile facilities until age 18.

The bill will result in minors in Department of Corrections custody to be held in Division of Juvenile Justice facilities until age 18. The number of additional residents is expected to be low. The Department of Corrections and Department of Health and Social Services will develop an agreement to address interagency costs. No additional resources by either agency will be requested.
