Below are details of the U.S. Department of Education, Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), federal title programs that pass through the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development (DEED). Additional information is available on DEED's website https://education.alaska.gov/esea.

Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)

Title I - Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged (CFDA 84.010A)

Title I, Part A Grants – Basic - Funds provided through a formula to districts to serve high poverty schools to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging State academic achievement standards and state academic assessments. **Funding is 91.09% of the total grant award.**

Title I, Part A Administration - Funds for state administration are placed into consolidated administration. Up to 1% of the state allocation may be used unless capped by law. **Funding is 0.08% of the total grant award.**

Title I, Part A School Improvement sec 1003(a) - Funds set-aside (up to 4% as allowed) from Title I-A state allocation to provide school improvement (SI) grants under section 1003(a) to schools in improvement, corrective action, or restructuring. 95% of the set-aside is awarded to districts through a formula to districts that have eligible schools. **Funding is 6.65% of the total grant award.**

Title I, Part A School Improvement sec 1003(a) State Activities - 5% of the SI set-aside for school improvement is kept by the state for activities for the state system of support to support schools in improvement. **Funding is .034% of the total grant award.**

Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 - Funds provided through Title I, Part A state allocation to be awarded through a competitive grant process to districts to support programs for neglected, delinquent and at-risk youth. **Funding is 1.0% of the total grant award.** (Percentage varies by year through Title I formula)

Title IA School Improvement Grants (SIG) Sec 1003(g) (CFDA 84.377)

Sec 1003(g) School Improvement Grants (SIG) - Grants awarded to states to make competitive sub grants to districts to provide adequate resources in order to raise substantially the achievement of students in their lowest-performing schools. **Funding is 96% of the total grant award.**

Sec 1003(g) School Improvement Grants State Activities - Funds reserved from the state allocation for administration, evaluation and technical assistance for schools receiving SIG awards. **Funding is 4% of the total grant award.**

<u>Title I, Part D, Subpart 1 – Neglected & Delinquent</u> (CFDA 84.013A)

Title I, Part D, Subpart 1 – Neglected & Delinquent Grants - Funds provided through formula grants to districts serving students in the youth and adult correctional facilities so that those youth have the opportunity to meet the same academic standards as all students. **Funding is 99.3% of the total grant award.**

Title I, Part D, Subpart 1 – Neglected & Delinquent Administration - Funds for state administration placed into consolidated administration. Up to 1% of state allocation may be used unless capped by law. **Funding is .06% of the total grant award.**

Title I, Part C Education of Migratory Children (CFDA 84.011A)

Title I-C Migrant Education Grants - Funding to identify and address the unique educational needs of migratory children and youth. Funding is allocated by the state to participating districts through a formula based on the number and needs of migrant eligible and served children. **The allocation is 93% of the total grant award.**

Title I-C Migrant Education Administration - Funds for state administration placed into consolidated administration. Up to 1% of state allocation can be retained unless capped by law. **The state's allocation is 1.0% of the total grant award.**

Title I-C Migrant Education State Activities - The state determines the percentage of the funding needed to operate state activities unique to the migrant program, including identification and recruitment of migratory children. The remainder is allocated to districts in grants. **The funding is 6% of the total grant award for the current year.**

<u>Title II, Part A - Supporting Effective Instruction</u> (CFDA 84.367A, CFDA 84.367B)

Title II-A Supporting Effective Instruction Formula Grants - Funds provided through formula grants to districts for the purpose of improving student achievement through strategies such as improving teacher and principal quality and increasing the number of effective teachers in the classroom and principals in schools. **Funding is 92.15% of the total grant awards.**

Title II-A Supporting Effective Instruction State Administration - Funds for state administration of II-A formula grants placed into consolidated administration. **Funding is 1.0% of the total grant awards.**

Title II-A State Activities - Funds for state activities to provide professional development and support to districts to improve the skills of teachers. **Funding is 4.0% of the total grant awards.**

Title II-A Principal Support – Funds for state activities to provide professional development and support to districts to improve the skills of principals and other school leaders. **Funding is 2.85% of the total grant awards.**

<u>Title III, Part A - Language Instruction for English Learners and Immigrant Students</u> (CFDA 84.365A)

Title III-A English Language Acquisition formula grants - Funds provided through formula grants to districts to help ensure that children who are English learners, including immigrant children and youth, attain English proficiency and meet the same academic standards as all children are expected to meet. Districts must have sufficient number of English learners to receive minimum grant award. **Funding is 85.55% of the total grant award.**

Title III-A Immigrant Grants - State must also set-aside a state-determined amount of up to 15% of state allocation to offer competitive grants to districts that have experienced a significant increase in the number or percent of immigrant children and youth. **Funding is .78** % of the total grant award.

Title III-A Administration - Funds for state administration of the formula and immigrant grant programs placed into consolidated administration. (State may reserve the greatest of 5% of the state allocation, or up to \$175,000 for state activities and administration. Of the amount reserved, 50% may be used for administration.) **Funding is 6.83% of the total grant award**

Title III-A State Activities - Funds set-aside for state activities to provide professional development activities and support to district staff in language instruction strategies and programs for English learners. **Funding is 6.83% of the total grant award.**

ESEA Title IV, Part A - Student Support and Academic Enrichment Grants (CFDA 84.424A)

Title IV-A Administration - States can retain up to 5% of the total award, using 1% for program administration and up to 4% for state level activities. Alaska is electing to retain the full 5%. 1% of this, is reserved for the administration costs associated with managing the program. The other 4%, is reserved for state level activities. (Sec 4104 (a) (1)(2). **Funding is 5.0% of the total grant award.**

Title IV-A formula grants - Districts are eligible for Title IV-A formula funds if they received Title I funding the preceding year. Districts that did not are ineligible per Sec. 4105(1). All remaining districts by using: "an amount that bears the same relationship to the total amount of such reservation as the amount the LEA received under subpart 2 of Part A of Title I for the preceding year bears to the total amount received by all LEAs in the State under such subpart for the preceding fiscal year." Sec 4105 (a) (1). Districts must receive an award of at least \$10,000 per Sec. 4105(a)(1). **Funding is 95% of the total grant award.**

ESEA Title IV-B Nita M. Lowey 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) (CFDA 84.287C)

Title IV-B 21st CCLC Competitive Grants - Provides competitive grants to districts and nonprofit entities for after-school and summer programs that increase student academic achievement by providing academic assistance and educational enrichment opportunities to students attending high-poverty and low-performing schools. **Funding is 95% of the total grant award.**

Title IV-B 21st CCLC Administration - Funds for state administration, including costs associated with running funding competition, placed into consolidated administration. **Funding is 2% of the total grant award.**

Title IV-B 21st CCLC State Activities – Funding is utilized to provide state grantees training, technical assistance, mentoring, and professional development in best practices to improve their capacity to provide quality afterschool programming. Funding is also used for monitoring and evaluation of program effectiveness. **Funding is 3% of the total grant award.**

Title VI Part A State Assessments (CFDA 84.369A)

Funds provided to pay the costs of the development of the State assessments and standards required by Title IA. **95.62% goes towards state assessments/standards; 4.38% State admin.**

<u>Title X McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children & Youth</u> (CFDA 84.196A)

McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children & Youth Grants - Funding awarded to states to make competitive grant awards to districts with the largest number of homeless children and youth to ensure that each has equal access to the same free, appropriate public education as other children and youths. Funding is 100.00% of the total grant award.

McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children & Youth State Activities - Funds to administer the McKinney-Vento grant program and to provide technical assistance and professional development to districts to increase their capacity to identify and provide services to homeless children and youth. Funding is 00.00% of the total grant award.
