STATE OF ALASKA 2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill provides enhanced caregiver support for individuals with severe disabilities who are moving into adulthood and would like to continue to reside in their familiar home setting. The bill establishes a new service type (adult foster care) and residential setting type (adult foster home) that may appeal to both recipients and their caregivers as an alternative care and living arrangement to current service and settings types.

The Division of Senior and Disabilities Services would administer the adult foster care service by certifying and monitoring providers who offer the service, and reviewing and approving support plans for those receiving the service. The division's review unit would be able to absorb the work from the expected additional plans (as these will largely be a continuation of services recipients received as children). The division's provider certification and compliance unit would require one additional permanent full-time Health Program Manager II, Range 19 in Anchorage to manage the work of certifying and monitoring these providers for compliance with service rules and requirements.

Health Program Manager II, Range 19: \$109.6 with a 50% Federal/50% General Fund Match. Annual position costs include: Travel: \$2.3; Services: \$4.6; Commodities: \$3.0. This position would be hired to begin July 1, 2022.

Regulations would be needed to define the expectations for qualifications and service delivery for these providers.
