

### **Three Pillars of Right to Shop**

#### The Right to Know:

Patients can find out the estimated price ahead of time from their insurance plan and compare providers to find one that works for them

#### The Right to Save:

Patients share in savings if they shop for a high-value provider (i.e. highquality, lower-cost)



### The Right to Pick:

Patients' access to high-value providers is protected—whether the providers are in- or out-ofnetwork



## Patients should know:



#### Prices differ depending on the door the patient picks


