My name is Louis Imbriani, and I am an Eagle River Resident. I am writing to you regarding HB-39. I am writing to you on my own time and I am not representing any groups or special interests. The thoughts and statements contained in this email are my own.

I currently oppose House Bill 39. This bill adds further obscurity to the voter rolls. While I'm sure the Division of Elections can differentiate between a registered and a pre-registered voter. However, it cannot differentiate between someone who still lives in state and who lives out of state. We already have a voter system that has many people who are on the voter roll, but they do not live in the state and are still registered.

The points that were brought up at the 4/16/2021 meeting by some of the invited testifiers were great and we should be promoting civic engagement and education to our youth. The issue currently lies with the way that some municipalities run their elections and with the way the voter rolls are set up.

I would be in support of this bill if Senate Bill 39 was passed. The latest version of SB-39 really strikes a balance. It allows for each city, town or municipality to conduct elections how they choose but with the added security and scrutiny that is outlined in the bill.

I believe that this bill, its lack of clarity and potential for mishaps further divide the current election crisis. I say the election crisis because that's what we have. People are losing faith in our elections and if election integrity is lost so is our republic. I urge that you put this bill on the back burner so to speak or incorporate it into SB-39 when it reaches the house.
