

- 4. MEHS students will participate in activities that promote well-being and leadership and will be prepared to positively impact their communities



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

Funding and Position History




# FY2022 Governor's Budget (All Funds) (\$ thousands)












# Budget Component: MEHS Facilities Maintenance (\$ thousands)

Mt. Edgecumbe Facilities Maintenance is primarily a combination of DOT shared agreement costs and Utilities, no direct personnel. Pool operations is also included.



## Budget Component: MEHS Facilities Maintenance

- Account and budget for the maintenance and repair, and renewal and replacement of state-owned education facilities at Mt. Edgecumbe High School (MEHS) in Sitka, Alaska
  - No FY2022 Governor's Budget Changes from FY2021
- > Includes MEHS Aquatic Center (not a separate budget component)
  - In FY2020, pool was funded by school funds
  - In FY2021, pool is being primarily funded by general funds (through the state facility maintenance component) and some receipts with a smaller amount expected to be funded by school funds


