FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This legislation proposes a number of changes to the Division of Elections' (division) current election procedures. Until the division is able to fully evaluate whether the processes being proposed are additional or duplicative to current procedures, an estimate of fiscal impact cannot be determined. Provisions being proposed that will result in increased costs include ballot security and chain of custody, the establishment of an election offense hotline and programming changes resulting from revisions to the Permanent Fund Dividend automatic voter registration program.

At this time, the Division of Elections submits an indeterminate fiscal note.
