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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

Proposed changes include the requirement that certain juvenile offenders who are appearing in adult courts would be detained in DJJ facilities instead of DOC facilities. It further brings the state into compliance with the federal Juvenile Justice Reform Act.
To the extent that AST Court Services Officers would be required to transport juvenile offenders from DJJ to courts instead of from DOC facilities, an increase in AST resources would be required. Since the anticipated number of such events is very low, DPS is submitting a zero fiscal note as the proposed changes do not significantly impact the duties of the department.

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
