Senator Micciche:

On behalf of the U.S. Department of Defense, I am writing in support of the policy relating to temporary courtesy licenses for spouses of active duty members of the armed forces as reflected in SB 12. This policy improves upon Alaska's current statute regarding occupational licensure for military spouses.

The Department if grateful to the Alaska Legislature for making strides to improve the transition of military members and their families. Many military families require two incomes to achieve their aspirations and frequent moves can inhibit a military spouse's ability to start and sustain a career. Differing licensing requirements can limit advancement or deter re-entry into the workforce at a new location. Spouses often suffer long periods of unemployment and therefore, loss of needed income to the family. Alaska's efforts to reduce these burdens is recognized and appreciated by the Department.
