My name is Abigail Turner-Franke, I am a resident of Soldotna, Alaska. I make use of a trail behind my home to the Kenai River every summer to fish in a sweet spot with friends and family. I also have friends that are sports guides, charter fishermen, and whose small businesses depend on revenues from visitors to Alaska every year. I do not discount the role of tourism, sport and personal use fisheries in our state.

However, equally important are revenues from commercial fishing directly through taxes, fees, or indirectly through resident fishermen that spend their money in communities around the state maintaining their businesses (vessel maintenance, port storage, improvements, medical), feeding their kids on school field trips, buying supplies for home improvement projects, groceries and locally made Christmas gifts. Frankly, sport business owners that live here do the same, but there are simply more resident commercial fishing operators and deckhands.

Commercial fishermen have been discounted and villainized over the last several years. Your guess is as good as mine why this shift has taken place in Alaska and why the Board of Fish is so grossly out of balance. Marit Carlson-Van Dort was presented as a fair and balanced candidate for the Board of Fish with rural, coastal roots. Her record on the Board of Fish has shown that she votes almost exclusively with sport interests, UNLESS a proposal or action impacts her home community of Chignik where she serves as president of the Chignik Village Corporation, Far West, Inc. Her blatant bias cloaked as a conservation concern is troubling.

Let's not pretend. State fisheries management has done, for the most part, an exceptional job just about everywhere, but the Cook Inlet over the last several decades. The political pressure from all sides in the Inlet has ruined several fisheries. And then their are natural cycles, and we certainly should be dealing into what is going on to try and prevent future events like what has happened in Chignik. But a pound of flesh from a neighbor will NOT bring back salmon runs. That Cook Inlet "eye for an eye" type of management is creeping into other parts of Alaska. Allowing "legacy" advocates or tactics, again on all sides, to continue driving the bus is the definition of madness.

Please do not confirm Marit Carlson-Van Dort. In a world where documentaries villainize anyone harvesting a fish are applauded all over the world (Seaspiracy on Netflix), let us get on track to true maximum sustainable yield for everyone. Our great state's constitution calls for this and has made us a uniquely successful region in the world. A balanced Board of Fisheries is a step in the right direction.
