### STATE OF ALASKA 2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB183

## Analysis

HB 183 would extend the sunset date and rename the Alaska Criminal Justice Commission to the Alaska Criminal Justice Data Analysis Commission (the Commission). Other changes include: (1) a change to the membership of the Commission; (2) changes to the purpose of the Commission to reflect updates around analysis, research, and appropriation recommendations from the recidivism reduction fund (AS 43.61.010(c)); (3) recommendations for changing criminal sentence practices and criminal justice practices; and (4) conforming changes to other statutes to reflect the name change and the sunset date change.
This bill allows the Commissioner of the Department of Health and Social Services to vote as a member of the Alaska Criminal Justice Data Analysis Commission.
This bill requires the Department of Health and Social Services to provide a description for the annual report of state-funded treatment programs designed to promote rehabilitation. The bill also states that the department - in cooperation with the Alaska Criminal Justice Data Analysis Commission - may implement the Recidivism Reduction program under AS 47.38.100(b).
Provided the Commission's recommendations don't change from currently funded programs, the division does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this bill.

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
