Analysis

The bill overhauls the licensing statute for alcohol related businesses and includes minor alignments in the crimes and offenses related to underage conduct involving alcohol. Offenses related to the underage consumption and possession of alcohol were amended under SB165 in 2016 (Chapter 32 SLA 16). This bill applies a similar methodology to the offenses of *purchase by a person under 21 years of age* and *delivery to a person under 21 years of age*.

Under existing statute, juvenile offenders cited for these offenses are referred to the Division of Juvenile Justice. Referral to the division for these offenses is rare. The misdemeanor offense of *delivery to a person under 21 years of age* is most commonly referred, with 24 referrals in the last five fiscal years. The bill will have no fiscal or major programmatic impact on the Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Juvenile Justice.
