Resume Addendum:

In the interest of full disclosure and transparency: I received a violation for accidentally taking two muskox on a hunt about 15 years ago. I self-reported the incident to authorities immediately. I was archery hunting and attempting to take what appeared to be a single, already wounded bull muskox in deep snow from a distance of about 30 yards. The snow was deep enough and the hair long enough that I couldn't see the feet of the small, yearling cow that was holding up the bull. It is common for muskox to hold up a wounded companion. My arrow completely penetrated both animals. There was a small fine issued, I was allowed to keep my bull and donate the cow to the village of Mekyoryuk. It does not appear on the "court view" system.
