FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This legislation will create a pathway for universal temporary licensure, a measure that establishes limited reciprocity for qualified practitioners who hold substantially equivalent licenses in other jurisdictions or who have demonstrated substantial compliance with licensing requirements in this state. This will allow the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to streamline the process and issue a one-year temporary license to qualified individuals.
The anticipated regulations project is minimal and the Division of Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing plans to absorb the cost into its existing expenditure authority.
Professional licensing programs within the Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing are funded by Receipt Supported Services, fund source 1156 Rcpt Svcs (DGF). Licensing fees for each occupation are set per AS 08.01.065 so the total amount of revenue collected approximately equals the occupation's actual regulatory costs.
