




DEC FY2023 Operating Budget: Leadership

Transfer EVOSTC from Fish and Game

- Administrative budget for the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Settlement Trustee Council (EVOSTC)
- The Trustees agree the best location for this is within DEC
- This is a technical change that will have no impact on EVOSTC operations
- Transfer \$2,400.7 and 3 positions
 - \$456.9 Fed
 - \$1943.8 Other

DEC FY2023 Operating Budget: Division of Environmental Health (in thousands)

Assume Primacy of RCRA, Subtitle C

- Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) is a federal law that covers the management of solid waste
- Subtitle C covers the management of hazardous waste
- All states except Alaska and Iowa currently have primacy of Subtitle C
- Two-year application process; full primacy expected in FY2025
- Federal funds are available after primacy assumed which would replace \$400.0 of GF
- Increment Request
 - \$830.0 UGF
 - 6 FT Positions



DEC FY2023 Operating Budget: Division of Environmental Health (in thousands)

Replace Ocean Ranger Fees for Fish Tissue Testing

- The use of ocean ranger fees for fish tissue testing violates the Tonnage Clause of the U.S Constitution
- Fund source change
 - (\$324.6) OR Fees
 - \$324.6 UGF

<u>Align Fee Authority with Updated Federal Guidance</u>

- Updated guidance from EPA dictates more activity will be classified as Title V versus Title I
- This is a technical change that does not impact operations or permit requirements
- Fund Source Change
 - (\$350.0) Fed
 - **(**\$1,800.0) GFPR
 - \$2,150.0 Clean Air Protection Fund

- The Prevention Account will not have sufficient revenue in FY2023 to cover expenditures
- This is a technical change that has no impact to operations
- Fund Source Change
 - \$1,275.2 UGF
 - (\$1,275.2) Oil/Haz Fund

DEC FY2023 Operating Budget: Division of Water (in thousands)

Assumption of 404 Primacy

- Section 404 of the Clean Water Act regulates the discharge of dredged or fill material into waters and wetlands
- Primacy over 404 will provide streamlined permitting & greater certainty to the regulated community
- Most construction and development projects require a 404 permit
- Two-year application process; full primacy expected in FY2025
- Increment Request
 - \$4,904.0 UGF
 - 28 FT Positions
