FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 55

Analysis

This bill proposes to open the PERS Benefit Plan by adding a new benefit tier for peace officers and firefighters. New employees will be enrolled into the defined benefit plan and existing PERS P/F DCR members will be allowed an opportunity to convert to the new defined benefit tier.

The Division of Retirement and Benefits will require two non-permanent employees, an Accountant III and a Publications Technician III (personal services) plus computer, phone, cubicle, supplies (commodities) for the first fiscal year to complete the preparation work to account for the participant contributions and produce new program literature and forms. The Division will need to reprogram its computer systems, program a plan comparison tool for employees and print/post online the necessary documents and election forms for the inception of the new tiers as well as update existing publications (services).

Education to employers will be required to properly electronically report service and salaries of new employees and existing employees of the PERS DCR Plan that elect to convert. Education to employees will be required for PERS DCR employees to make an informed decision during the election period and for new members of the new tier which will require travel to employer worksites (travel).

A fiscal note that includes an updated actuarial analysis will be submitted once the analysis has been received. This fiscal note only addresses the estimated administrative costs to the Division.
