


National Data

* Figure is current year-to-date. All data is lagged by three days. <u>Full methodology</u> **Source:** Gun Violence Archive











Law Enforcement Data - Call for Service






Criminal Prosecutions Filed



It is the duty and obligation of the District Attorney to ensure that citizen's constitutional rights are safeguarded at every step of the criminal prosecution.



Recruitment and Retention Attrition

- Prosecutors 2018 (new positions not included)
- 36.5% of prosecutor positions turned over (42 of 115)
- Prosecutors 2019 (new positions not included)
- 22.3% of prosecutor positions turned over (27 of 121)
- Prosecutors 2020 (new positions not included)
- 15.8% of prosecutor positions turned over (20 of 126)
- Prosecutors 2021 (new positions not included)
- 20.6% of prosecutor positions turned over (27 of 131)

Recruitment and Retention Applicant Shortage

- 63 offers in last 2 years
 - 2 resigned with 3 months
 - 2 issues with admission to the Alaska Bar
 - 1 deceased
 - 7 refused (ranges 20-22)




Figure 1 depicts the gap that has emerged since 2013 between the percentage increase in job openings and the percentage decrease in number of applicants.




4.5% lawyers in Alaska over last decade












JAN 2007 (total of 112)




JAN 2011 (total of 129)

Survey Of Current Employees

- 149 employees surveyed 100% response rate
- Recommend Law as place to work to friends and family?
 - 44% not likely
 - 35% passive
 - 21% would recommend
- Most important for staying in position (top 5 responses)
 - Pay
 - Work / life balance (workload)
 - Benefits
 - Culture
 - Growth opportunities

NDAA Annual Salary Report

"Founded in 1950, the National District
Attorneys Association (NDAA) is a national, nonpartisan non-profit membership association that
provides training, technical assistance and services
to prosecutors around the country in support of
the prosecution profession."

- 15 communities: 5 Large Cities, 5 Mid-Sized Cities, 5 Small Cities
 - Anchorage was one of the five small cities
 - Current supply of talent "significant shortage"
 - Recommended starting salary of \$87,564
- Recommended recruiting "boomerang" employees and recruiting from other metro areas

Recruitment and Retention Department Response

The Department's most valuable resource is its people.

Recruitment, retention, and ongoing support of a skilled and qualified workforce is critical to sustaining successful legal outcomes for Alaska and protecting the public.

- Expanded recruitment posting locations
- Improve recruitment materials
- Media presence traditional and social
- Increase training staff and attorneys
- Evaluate pay, rural housing, workloads, more flexible work structure, promotional opportunities

Rural Unit (Federal Grant) Recruitment

- September 2019 \$1.4 million awarded over a 3 year period
 - Grant ends Oct. 2022 Seeking to reapply
- 2 prosecutors and 1 support staff
- Acquired space, equipment, and hired one prosecutor and support staff by Jan 2020
- Additional 5 months to find a second prosecutor, in part because several of our prosecutors went to US Attorney's Office while additional prosecutors left for other reasons
- That prosecutor slated to start in September of 2020 backed out within a week of the start date (after holding the open for them for 3 months)
- Finally filled with an internal transfer (then recruited for that vacated position)

Rural Unit (Federal Grant) <u>Successes</u>

- Provide coverage to rural/small offices
 - Sitka
 - Kodiak
 - Dillingham
 - Bethel
 - Kotzebue both ADAs appointed to bench in 2019 within a month
 - 196 work days of coverage = 39.2 weeks = 9.8 months
 - Almost 3000 hours of work covered almost entirely by one prosecutor
- Trainings to Law Enforcement and Prosecutors
 - Onboarding or mentoring 4 prosecutors (Special Prosecutions, Kotzebue, and Bethel)
 - 15 formal trainings (Sitka, Bethel, Dillingham, Kotzebue)
 - Search and seizure, sex crime investigations, domestic violence (DV) crime investigations, trial prep, negotiations, motion work, and case management

Rural Unit (federal grant) <u>Successes</u>

- Trials 5
 - Felony sex crime in June of 2021 x2 (both guilty)
 - Third felony sex crime currently underway, but delays due to juror, defendant, and defense attorney all contracting COVID at different times
 - September of 2021
 - Unclassified felony in 2021 pled on eve of trial
- High Profile Cases as a Sample
 - 4 DV-murder cases and one with 10-year-old victim
 - 8 felony sex crimes
- 50 Unclassified Felonies Currently Assigned
- Cases Covered To Date

• Felonies: 1005 Misdemeanors: 853

Violent Felonies: 574Sex Felonies: 181

Convictions: 604
