This legislation statutorily prohibits discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity or expression under Alaska human rights law enforced by the Alaska State Commission for Human Rights (Commission). Based upon legal guidance, the Commission began interpreting "sex" under Alaska law to encompass sexual orientation and gender ident or expression after the Supreme Court's decision in <i>Bostock v. Clayton County</i> , 140 S. Ct. 1731 (2020), so there is no fisc impact to the Commission from this legislation.
