FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This bill eliminates the preliminary teaching certificate and allows an educator with a valid out-of-state teaching certificate to qualify for a regular teaching certificate based on the valid out-of-state teaching certificate and criminal history background check.

An educator with a valid out-of-state teaching certificate would not be required to show evidence of completing a baccalaureate degree. An out-of-state teacher qualifying for this certificate type would not be required to pass a competency exam and would have three years instead of two years to satisfy the Alaska studies and multicultural coursework. An out-of-state teacher qualifying for this certificate type would also have three years to satisfy the mandatory training requirements.

No effective date has been provided.

The department would need to review regulations and make necessary changes to bring teacher certification regulations into conformity. There is a one-time increment of \$6.0 to implement the necessary regulation changes.
