Analysis

This bill will amend AS 41.15.030(b) to allow DNR to use existing general fund appropriations to pay emergency firefighting personnel to perform nonemergency work related to hazardous fuels reduction. This bill will not result in any changes to departmental revenue. Emergency firefighters will be paid with existing appropriations from FY21 and FY22 capital budgets for Fire Risk Reduction and Fuel Break activities, therefore, the division submits a zero fiscal note.
