No scientific support for requiring the vaccine for those with natural immunity

Dr. Marty Makary, a <u>professor</u> at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and editor-in chief of <u>MedPage Today</u>, is pushing back against the growing drumbeat for mass vaccinations and COVID vaccine mandates.

In an <u>interview with U.S. New & World Reports</u>, Makary said mandating vaccines for "every living, walking American" is not well-supported by science. Makary also expressed concerns about the two-dose vaccine regimen for adolescents.

Makary said there is no scientific support for requiring the vaccine in people who have <u>natural immunity</u> — that is, immunity from prior COVID infection. There is zero clinical outcome data to support arguing dogmatically that natural immune individuals "must get vaccinated."

Makary explained:

"During every month of this pandemic, I've had debates with other public researchers about the effectiveness and durability of natural immunity. I've been told that natural immunity could fall off a cliff, rendering people susceptible to infection. But here we are now, over a year and a half into the clinical experience of observing patients who were infected, and natural immunity is effective and going strong. And that's because with natural immunity, the body develops antibodies to the entire surface of the virus, not just a spike protein constructed from a vaccine."

A recent <u>Israeli study</u> affirmed the superiority of natural immunity. Health Ministry data on the wave of COVID outbreaks which began in May 2021, found a 6.72 times greater level of protection among those with natural immunity compared to those with vaccinated immunity.
