METRICS AND MEASURES: BENCHMARKS FOR TWO DEPARTMENTS

Division Directors have identified numerous goals to follow the reorganization of the Department of Health and Social Services into a Department of Family and Community Services (DFCS) and Department of Health (DOH). These measurable, qualitative, and quantitative objectives have been organized into the two new departments:

DFCS DOH

Reduce turnover of front-line Office of Children's Services by 20% within 12 months

Achieve full census capability at API within 12 months

Fully utilize Alaska Pioneer Homes to meet the needs of communities within 12 months

Address increase recruitment and retention of Juvenile Justice Officers by 25% within 12 months

Improve community-based alternatives for dual system youth (OCS & DJJ) to reduce the length of stay in detention and admissions to secure treatment programming by 15% for OCS/DJJ involved youth within 12 months

Improve processing rate for procurement and contracts to under 90 days within 6 months

Consolidate licensing regulations for long-term care facilities, group homes, and foster homes are voluminous as a standalone function.

Community stakeholder outreach meetings held to better understand needed regulatory changes that encourages effective licensing of community care providers

Growth in foster homes and additional specialized homes/services to meet children's needs

Improve hiring, recruitment, and retention, and increase effective inter-departmental collaboration, including but not limited to:

- Hire and retain a Finance Officer and full Grants and Contracts team
- Standardize collaboration between the sections of the Division of Public Health and Medicaid Divisions to focus on Preventative services and Chronic conditions
- Reduce vacancies within the Division of Public Health by 25% within 12 months

Plan, and implement, Medicaid demonstration projects in order to determine efficacy and potential cost containment within 24 months, as follows:

- Care Organization based in a single Region
- Issue RFP(s) and awards for new coordinated care demonstration projects
- Increase Medicaid billable School Based Services
- Implement DRG methodology

Improve processing rate for procurement and contracts to under 90 days within 6 months

Increase service availability through the following efforts:

- Successfully implement an online application for Medicaid and other public assistance programs
- See new providers operationalize crisis services in each of the 9 regions identified in the 1115 behavioral health waiver
