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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This bill amends AS 44.41 relating to the Department of Public Safety (DPS) by adding a new subsection requiring DPS to submit to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) a report of each incident in which a state trooper or village public safety officer (VPSO) uses force against a person. The bill also requires DPS to prepare an annual report to the legislature detailing information contained in the reports that DPS, the Department of Corrections, and municipalities submitted to the FBI in the preceding year.

The FBI's National Use of Force Data Collection program was created to provide nationwide statistics on law enforcement use of force incidents and officially began collecting use of force data in January 2019. DPS currently submits reports of each incident in which a state trooper uses force against a person to the FBI's National Use of Force Data Collection program. DPS is seeking guidance from the FBI on whether incidents in which a VPSO uses force against a person is eligible to be submitted to the National Use of Force Data Collection program.

Preparation of an annual report to the legislature can be accomplished with existing staff and at no additional cost. However, the annual report will only include information contained in those reports that were submitted to the FBI by the other agencies.

As DPS is already participating in the FBI's National Use of Force Data Collection program, the passage of this bill would have no fiscal impact to DPS. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is being submitted.
