On January 1, 2022, Alaska had 193 active emergency teacher certificates. According to the districts requesting the emergency certificate, the only candidates that were available for their vacant positions did not satisfy one or more of the requirements for Initial teacher certification:

- Bachelor's degree or higher (4 applicants)
- Approved teacher prep program (76 applicants)
- Basic competency exam (117 applicants)
- Content area exam (118 applicants)

Alaska Teacher Endorsement Information

Endorsements on Alaska's Initial and Professional teacher certificates can only be granted based on the requirements in 4 AAC 12.395 and 4 AAC 12.396.

The following methods are used to determine if an applicant is eligible for an endorsement.

1. Endorsement program completion:

This method requires the completion of a state-approved teacher preparation or endorsement program and passing scores on the endorsement-related content area exam. If an endorsement is completed outside of Alaska, the applicant must be eligible to gain a comparable endorsement or certificate, including any required testing, for that state.

This is the only method to add grade levels to an endorsement.

2. Posted Degree, Major, or Minor:

This method requires completion of at least one of the following degrees in the content or specialist area for which the endorsement is requested:

- a. a doctorate degree;
- b. a master's degree; or
- c. a baccalaureate degree, with a major or posted minor of at least 18 semester hours in the endorsement area requested.

This method <u>is not</u> available for elementary, reading, English as a foreign language, or special education endorsements.

3. Content Area Knowledge & Teaching Experience:

This method requires two years of teaching experience in the content area and passing scores on the endorsement-related content area exam. Only where <u>content area exam(s)</u> (education.alaska.gov/teachercertification/contentareaexams) have been identified may endorsements be added with this method.

This method <u>is not</u> available for elementary, reading, English as a foreign language, or special education endorsements.

4. Career and Technical (CTE - Teaching): This method requires the following:

- Two years of teaching experience in a Career and Technical Education (CTE) area;
- Six semester hours of coursework focused on classroom management;
- Student assessment and CTE specific teaching strategies; and
- Successful completion of an approved CTE content-specific industry competency exam as approved by the department.

Initial Out-of-State teaching certificates will reflect the endorsements listed on the current, valid out-of-state teaching certificate submitted with the application packet as indicated by AS 14.20.015(c).
