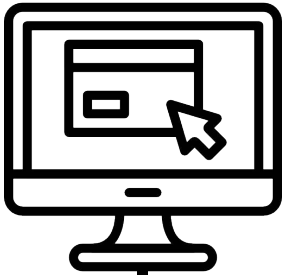
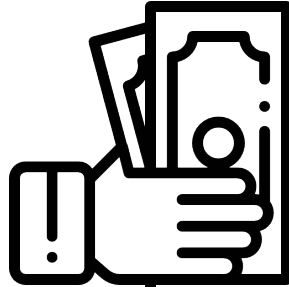


The Pull-Tabs Process: A Timeline

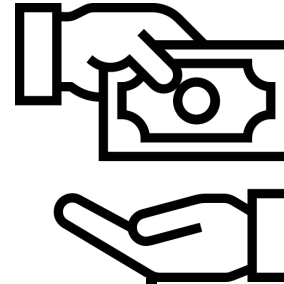
A charity applies online for a pull-tab gaming permit from the Department of Revenue.



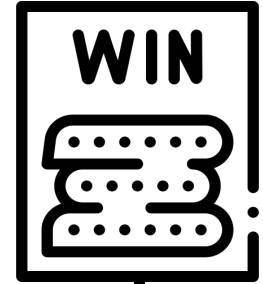
The charity (also known as a permittee) purchases a pull-tab game from a licensed pull-tab distributor.



In exchange, the vendor gives the charity a check representing 70% of the projected profit.



The vendor sells pull-tabs to customers and pays out winnings, retaining approximately 30% of the projected profit.



The charity registers a vendor (typically a bar) to sell pull-tabs on their behalf.



The charity picks up the boxes of pull-tabs from the pull-tab distributor and physically delivers them to the vendor.



The charity deposits the check and reports its gaming proceeds to the Department of Revenue.
