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# NTIA— State Broadband Programs National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA)

\$42.5 B — Broadband Equity, Access, and Development Program (BEAD)

- Unserved locations defined as no access to 25/3 Mbps<sup>3</sup>
- Underserved locations defined as no access to 100/20 Mbps<sup>3</sup>
- Community anchor institutions defined as lacking gigabit connections

\$2.75 B — Digital Equity Act (DEA) Programs - prioritizes individuals who are:


- Aging
- Incarcerated
- Have a language barrier
- Primarily reside in a rural area

- Veterans
- Live in households earning at/below • Members of a racial 150% of the poverty or ethnic minority line
- Individuals with disabilities
  - group

- \$1 B Enabling Middle Mile Infrastructure
  - Competitive Grant with broad eligible entity list that includes Tribal governments, Utilities, Nonprofits



## Office of Broadband



#### **Initial Funding:**

\$212 K: Economic Development Administration - Statewide Planning Grant

\$5 M: BEAD Five Percent for Administration and Planning Grant

\$1 M+: DEA Formula Funding Planning Grant



### State Comments on BEAD and DEA

#### Allow BEAD funding to be used for middle-mile

\*Assumed to be eligible, but not explicit in IIJA

#### Provide a small amount of funding for immediate deployment use

\*Let's not make unserved areas of our state wait years for grants

#### Take Alaska into account when creating "high-cost" area definition

- \*10% of BEAD funding reserved for high-cost areas
- \*Alaska is an extreme outlier and should be prioritized

#### A "broadband parity adjustment" should be an eligible use of funds

\*With significant federal funds coming to Alaska, some could be made available for this purpose

#### Allow BEAD funding to be used for State of Alaska Broadband Assistance Grant Program (DEED)

\*Broadband Assistance Grants help schools get to 25/3 broadband speeds; BEAD funding could supplement

#### Unify the BEAD and Digital Equity Act deliverables

\*Reduce duplicative work and improve efficiency by combining State planning for NTIA BEAD & Digital Equity Act (DEA) programs



### BEAD Initial & Near Term Work

# Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD)

- \$100 Million Minimum State Allocation
- 5% = \$5 Million Planning (and Administration) Grant
- NOFO Release Mid-May 2022
- Notice of Intent Letter (No guidance yet on turn-around time)
- Approval of NOI by NTIA
- Access to \$5 Million Planning Grant
- Development of 5-Year Action Plan


# Deployment Funding (under BEAD)

- \$100 Million Minimum Allocation
  - High Cost Formula Funding
- Unserved and Underserved Formula Funding

# Digital Equity Act (DEA)

- Three Components
  - Planning Grants (\$64 Million Nationwide)
  - Capacity Grants
  - Competitive Grants
- Formula Based Funding Allocation
- Planning Grant NOFO Estimated Release Mid-June 2022
- NOI due within 60 days of NOFO
- Planning Grant Awarded (estimated \$1 Million+)
- Digital Equity Plan due within 1 year of award

# Additional Funding (under DEA)

- Capacity Grants
- Competitive Grants
