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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB295

Analysis

This legislation is expected to have an impact on Medicaid provider enrollment. The requirements in Sec 08.36.242 and Sec 08.36.243 relating to specialist licenses are expected to increase volume of enrollment change requests and the level of effort to process new enrollment applications. Outreach will be necessary to collect specialty licenses for currently enrolled providers. In addition, Health Care Services anticipates an increased number of new applicants in out years due to this new license type. This additional scope of work cannot be absorbed by current staff and reflects an anticipated increase of one permanent part-time Medicaid Program Specialist 2 position, located in Anchorage.
Personal Services: one part-time Medicaid Program Specialist 2 (including benefits), range 18, Anchorage \$92.0
Commodities: office supplies: \$0.5 annually
One-time Commodities Cost: computer, software, and office equipment: \$2.5

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
