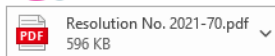

To the Senators of the State Senate Affairs Committee,

I'm writing to implore you to support Senate Bill 156 to make any vaccine mandates or vaccine passports unlawful in the state of AK.

Nobody should be coerced in any way to receive a medical treatment, especially if that treatment comes with risks, and even more especially if the full extent of those risks are unknown. To do so is an outright attack on Alaskans' civil, inherent and religious rights as listed in Article 1 of the AK constitution - causing inequality between those vaccinated and unvaccinated, denying individuals the ability to make free-will decisions to protect their life and liberty and pursuit of happiness, and violating the moral objections of the religious.

I reach out to you as a concerned Alaskan, wife, mother of 5 and a business owner. I have held trust in our medical system most of my life. I was adamant about receiving vaccinations on schedule. I never considered myself an "anti-vaxxer".
