* Section 1. The following appropriation items are for operating expenditures from the
general fund or other funds as set out in section 2 of this Act to the agencies named for the
purposes expressed for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023,
unless otherwise indicated. A department-wide, agency-wide, or branch-wide unallocated
reduction set out in this section may be allocated among the appropriations made in this
section to that department, agency, or branch.

* Sec. 7. PURPOSE. In accordance with AS 37.14.003 and 37.14.005, the appropriations made in this Act are for the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program.

* Sec. 8. NONGENERAL FUND RECEIPTS. (a) Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority

- * Sec. 8. NONGENERAL FUND RECEIPTS. (a) Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority authorized receipts (AS 37.14.036) or administration receipts (AS 37.14.036) that exceed the amounts appropriated in this Act are appropriated conditioned upon compliance with the program review provisions of AS 37.07.080(h).
- (b) If Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority authorized receipts (AS 37.14.036) or administration receipts (AS 37.14.036) fall short of the estimates used as the basis of the appropriation, the affected appropriation is reduced by the amount of the shortfall in receipts.
- * Sec. 9. SALARY AND BENEFIT ADJUSTMENTS. (a) The appropriations made in sec. 1 of this Act include amounts for salary and benefit adjustments for public officials, officers, and employees of the executive branch, Alaska Court System employees, employees of the legislature, and legislators and to implement the monetary terms for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, of the following ongoing collective bargaining agreements:
- (1) Alaska Correctional Officers Association, representing the correctional officers unit;
- (2) Public Safety Employees Association, representing the regularly commissioned public safety officers unit;
 - (3) Alaska Public Employees Association, for the supervisory unit;
 - (4) Public Employees Local 71, for the labor, trades, and crafts unit.
- (b) The appropriations made to the University of Alaska in sec. 1 of this Act include amounts for salary and benefit adjustments for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, for university employees who are not members of a collective bargaining unit and to implement the monetary terms for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, of the following collective bargaining agreements:
 - (1) Alaska Higher Education Crafts and Trades Employees, Local 6070;
 - (2) Fairbanks Firefighters Union, IAFF Local 1324.
- (c) If a collective bargaining agreement listed in (a) of this section is not ratified by the membership of the respective collective bargaining unit, the appropriations made in this Act applicable to the collective bargaining unit's agreement are adjusted proportionately by the amount for that collective bargaining agreement, and the corresponding funding source

amounts are adjusted accordingly.

(d) If the Fairbanks Firefighters Union, IAFF Local 1324 collective bargaining
agreement listed in (b)(2) of this section is not ratified by the membership of the Fairbanks
Firefighters Union, IAFF Local 1324 collective bargaining unit and approved by the Board of
Regents of the University of Alaska, the appropriations made in this Act applicable to the
Fairbanks Firefighters Union, IAFF Local 1324 collective bargaining agreement are adjusted
proportionately by the amount for the collective bargaining agreement, and the corresponding
