Chair Kreiss-Tomkins and committee members:

Thank you for holding an initial hearing on Senate Bill 161, relating to the definition of political parties, on April 9, 2022. Please see the following response to Representative Eastman's question.

1: Representative Eastman asked how many political groups have applied to the Division of Elections to have registered voters counted in pursuit of being officially recognized as a political party.

There are currently 11 groups who are seeking recognition as political parties. These groups have been added to the voter registration form and the Division of Elections publishes the number of registered voters for these group each monthly. These groups are listed below in the order they appear on the Division's April 3, 2022 registered voters report:

Alaska Constitution Party: 699 registered voters
Moderate Party of Alaska: 293 registered voters
FreedomReform Party: 2 registered voters
Green Party of Alaska: 1,479 registered voters
OWL Party: 61 registered voters
Alliance Party of Alaska: 32 registered voters
Libertarian Party of Alaska: 6,822 registered voters
Progressive Party of Alaska: 189 registered voters
Patriot's Party of Alaska: 179 registered voters
Veterans Party of Alaska: 1,353 registered voters
UCES' Clown Party: 140 registered voters
