My name is Tina Johnson . I am an Alaskan Native Tlingit from the Kaagwaantaan Clan. I am also a shareholder of Huna Totem Corporation. I was born and raised in Hoonah, Alaska and have made it my home for over 70 years.

Hoonah opened a cannery in 1912 that was in operation when I was a child. My father was a fisherman and my mother worked there. We used to live at one of the cannery cabins as a family during the fishing season. I would make trips to picnic on the beach in front of the cannery as I grew my own family. I used to take my grandchildren there all the time. I would take them fishing off the beach.

In 2004, Huna Totem Corporation renovated the old cannery, naming it Icy Strait Point and turned it in to an attractive tourist destination. Icy Strait point has restaurants, a crab shack, gift shops and more. This was to help our struggling town with jobs and bring money to our businesses. Things were going well until covid, and like all other tourism in Alaska, our businesses got hit hard.

In response to the covid pandemic, Icy Strait Point (Huna Totem Corporation sister company) is requiring vaccinations for all employees, guests and any residents who want to visit Icy Strait Point. Employees are unable to make their own choices regarding the vaccine. Along with those mandates, they are not allowing residents of Hoonah and even Huna Totem shareholders to come down to Icy Strait Point without a vaccine. It angers me to see the requirements of the vaccine being enforced in our small town. We see and feel the division it is causing. As a shareholder, it makes me angry to see that it is my corporations money that funds this place to operate, and I can't even step foot on our property. It is my right and any individuals' right to say I am not going to take the vaccine and I should not be penalized for it. Tourists can get off the cruise ship, use the cannery for touring and walk in to our village. It is outright discrimination to say I, an unvaccinated person do not have access to my land. I would like to see the SB 156 pass and stop this division in my community.

I am reaching out to you again. Thank you so much for supporting Alaskans and for speaking with me directly. I know you are not my representative, but I really appreciate all you have done for your constituents. I did leave a recording with Representative Kreiss-Tomkins to schedule SB 156 in State Affairs immediately. Also, I sent out the following message to my elected officials, Senator Hughes and Representative Tilton.

My name is Sherry Strizak, a resident of Chugiak, Alaska. Until March 12, 2022, I was an air traffic controller with the FAA in Anchorage, Alaska at Merrill Field. I have worked for the FAA since February 2001. The FAA removed (fired) me from federal service before I could retire in July. I am also a veteran with an honorable discharge, having served in the U.S. Air Force for 9 1/2 years (1990-1999). I have a total of over 30+ years federal service.

On November 7, 2021, I invoked my religious exemption for all unwanted medical interventions. I had no choice as the FAA was mandating vaccinations. Despite my requests to work, I was not allowed entry into my facility because, as a Christian, I could not participate in COVID activities. Unless I used my sick or annual leave, I was placed on Absent Without Leave (AWOL). I was suspended for 10 days in January 2022. I have appealed every adverse action and reasonable accommodation denial to no avail. When the continued harassment, humiliation, intimidation, coercion and retaliation did not affect a change in my stance for body autonomy the FAA merely fired me. I am now in the formal EEO complaint process. I expect no resolution with the EEO process either as our government is corrupt.

I am a 4th generation American, the daughter of a Slovakian coal miner whose ancestors mined the Anthracite region of Pennsylvania. Socioeconomically, I started out my journey in life with very little except my wits and chutzpah. My father passed away when I was a young girl which left me no choice except to succeed. So, I climbed up out of the gutter to better myself. I was the only one who would be able to look after my mother and sister as both are disabled. I met a wonderful man whom I married in 1999. We are the proud parents of two young men. My eldest son was accepted to attend the U.S. Naval Academy's summer seminar in June, but we will now have to turn it down because I do not want him to be harmed.

On a personal note, I know two people who have been injured from the COVID vaccine. A gentleman I worked with now has a damaged heart from the vaccine. My aunt had her left leg amputated after blood clots resulted in the death of tissue. I know people who have been fired from their jobs just like me and others who work under what can only be described as Nazi Germany at this point.

It is because of my family and friends that I am taking a stand against tyranny. I cannot tolerate anyone telling another how to live their life. I am willing to fight for what is right, not just for myself, but for everyone. And, I want my children to think highly of me because I expect them to also stand up for those who cannot stand up for themselves. Senator Reinbold, please do not stop fighting for us. We appreciate your support and dedication.

Perhaps it is time I step up to the plate and run for office. Thanks again for all you do for us, Senator Reinbold.


