## Explanation of Changes HB 19: LIMITED TEACHER CERTIFICATES; LANGUAGES Version B to I

1. Version B, page 2, lines 18-19, deletes "(f) of this section and" and page 2, lines 24-30, deletes all material. This change removed Section (f) which differentiated between teachers of Alaska Native languages and world languages for the purposes of certificate renewal. World language teachers (described as those teaching a language that is not an Alaska Native language) were limited to five years of licensure under the limited teacher certificate offered in AS 14.20.023. Teachers of Alaska Native languages could hold these certificates for longer than five years.
