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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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Analysis

HB 227 adds the word "resilience" to the municipal energy improvement assessment programs, naming them the "municipal energy and resilience improvement assessment programs". It allows a municipality to establish an energy improvement assessment program under AS 29.55.100 – AS 29.55.165 to include building resilience improvements. Additionally, HB 227 broadens the costs a municipality can finance and the costs that can be repaid for an energy or resilience improvement assessment.
The Division of Community and Regional Affairs does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this legislation.

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
