There is currently no definition for "economic development" in Title 29, which is problematic for municipalities when attempting put "tools" in place to assist with local economic development planning, including local economic diversification and small business development strategies.

FYI, the term "economic development" occurs in just five sections under Title 29, as follows:

- Eminent domain under AS 29.35.030. A 2006 amendment added language prohibiting eminent domain taking of private property for economic development (with exceptions); for this purpose, the definition of "economic development" was given the meaning in AS 09.55.240. We do not propose applying our new definition for "economic development" to this section relating to eminent domain.
- Expenditure of borough revenues under AS 29.35.110. Boroughs and cities in Alaska need the
 ability to pass-through state and federal grants targeting economic development such as those
 received during the COVID-19 public health emergency on an areawide basis while working
 cooperatively through an agreement. The new definition for "economic development" would
 apply to this section.
- 3. **Second class borough powers under** AS 29.35.210. This section enables second class boroughs to exercise "economic development" powers on a nonareawide basis. Working to ensure existing industries remain in an area is as important for its economic health as attracting new industries to a municipality. The new definition for "economic development" would apply to this section.
- 4. **Comprehensive planning under** AS 29.40.030. The new definition for "economic development" would apply to this section, which describes the components of a municipality's comprehensive plan.
- 5. Optional exemptions and exclusions under <u>AS 29.45.050</u>. Economic development should be defined more broadly to allow local governments to incentivize businesses not only to make initial investments within municipalities, but also to maintain current operations. The new definition for "economic development" would apply to this section.
