FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB 208

Analysis

SB 208 increases the property damage insurance requirements for construction contractors from a minimum of \$20,000 to \$100,000 for property damage; increases the amount under which contractors are exempt from this requirement from \$2,500 to \$5,000; requires contractors to provide written notice to clients accurately describing the levels and limits of their insurance coverage; and allows clients to bring civil action against a contractor for grossly negligent work if the client has made reasonable attempts to communicate with the contractor and the contract has been unresponsive or failed to act.
The Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.
Professional licensing programs within the Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing are primarily funded by Receipt Supported Services, fund source 1156 Rcpt Svcs (DGF). Licensing fees for each occupation are set per AS 08.01.065 so the total amount of revenue collected approximately equals the occupation's actual regulatory costs.
