#### FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

## STATE OF ALASKA 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. CSHB 66(SA)

#### **Analysis**

This legislation will make numerous revisions to Alaska's election laws which will impact the Division of Elections' services and procedures for all state-administered elections beginning with the 2024 primary and general elections. Significant changes include: (1) a new requirement to implement rigorous signature verification for by-mail voters; (2) adding a free online absentee ballot tracking system to include a tracking barcode for return ballots; (3) requiring routine forensic examination of precinct tabulators (4) enhanced voter list maintenance to ensure accuracy of voter rolls and professional audits of registered voters lists; (5) adding a toll free election offense hotline; (6) new requirements relating to oversight and destruction of used ballot materials; (7) requiring postage paid return envelopes with absentee ballots; (8) extending the length of operation of the absentee ballot review board; and (9) adding a requirement that the Alaska voting system use open-source software technology beginning in 2024.

The fiscal note includes operating costs beginning in FY24 in advance of the 2024 primary and general election and FY23 capital costs.

These legislative changes require the following unrestricted general fund expenses:

\$5,125.0 (Signature verification systems, software, support, and training for 5 regional offices)

\$ 100.0 (Ballot tracking system and software)

\$ 500.0 (Voter registration system modifications for language preference)

\$5,000.0 (New voting system using open-source software)
