This would have a devastating impact on our ability to notify people in rural communities of circumstances including earthquakes, tsunamis, wildfires, volcanic eruptions, and intense rainfall and snow-storms.

Public Radio also provides educational programming that helps young Alaskans learn; on-air message boards that enable communication between isolated rural residents with few other means; coverage of local government meetings and school and community sports; and locally created entertainment by musicians, writers, and others.

The ANSEP received \$9.5 million of federal COVID relief funds through the Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) to assist with expansion and institutionalization of the program. This \$4 million increase, in addition to the \$1 million requested in the FY2024 Governor's budget, for a total of \$5 million to ANSEP, will provide additional funding stream to support the Acceleration Academy High School expansion.	The ANSEP components include Kindergarten to Fifth Grade Academy, Middle School Academy, Acceleration Academy High School, University Success, Graduate Success, and Grow Our Own PhD. The ANSEP high schools are in Anchorage, Palmer, Bethel, and Kotzebue with additional schools starting up in Dillingham and Juneau. A residential high school has started up on the University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA) campus.
