Thank you for working on the increment for dementia. Please find information below that your office may find helpful in rebuttals.

63,000 Alaskans have subjective cognitive decline, and 25,000 Alaskans provide unpaid care as daily caregivers. The population of Alaskans with Alzheimer's is projected (and is on track for!) a 90% growth rate from 2020 to 2030. The FDA-approved treatments for Alzheimer's only work on patients who are in the earliest stages of dementia, so it is critical that people recognize the signs and symptoms of dementia before it progresses past the point of treatment. One in three Alaska Natives can expect to develop dementia, but Rural Alaskans of all races have limited access to state resources, education, materials, and services. This is why we need to ensure there's sufficient funding for rural outreach.

Considering your district, you may find it interesting that veterans have a greater risk for dementia due to their high prevalence of traumatic brain injury (TBI) and post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). This is one of the reasons why Alaska's Palmer Pioneer Home for veterans has a specialized memory care unit.
