FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 130

Analysis

This bill amends the crime of unlawful interference with an election by adding two more subsections to the statute. Alaska Statute (AS) 15.56.060(a)(5) makes it a crime to intentionally open or tamper with signed/sealed absentee ballots without authorization from the Division of Elections director. The second, AS 15.56.060(a)(6), makes it a crime to intentionally breach, hack, alter, or tamper with election machinery.
The bill adds a new crime of election fraud for violations of AS 15.56.060 with the intent to change the outcome of an election, making it a class B felony.
The bill amends AS 15.56.070 and the crime of election official misconduct in the first degree by adding a new subsection to the statute, AS 15.56.070(a)(4), for a non-election official to knowingly disclose, share, or report election results or any confidential election data before the polls close on election day.
The Alaska State Troopers enforce state laws. While this bill adds a new criminal offence of election fraud, and expands the crimes of interference with an election and election official misconduct, the impact is anticipated to be nominal, and the department is submitting a zero fiscal note.
