Analysis

This bill would allow certain family members (spouses and parents of minor children) and others who have a legal duty to support an individual to become paid caregivers when providing personal care under Alaska's Community First Choice program. The Division of Senior and Disabilities Services would approve these services and claims would be funded through Medicaid. Regulations would need to be amended to enact this bill. The bill is not expected to result in increased workload for the Division of Senior and Disabilities services staff, therefore, this is a zero-dollar fiscal note.
