FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB 143

Analysis

House Bill 143 would exempt post-use polymers and recovered feedstocks at an advanced recycling facility from the definitions of solid waste, industrial waste, and other waste. It specifies that advanced recycling facilities are not solid waste disposal facilities, and that the definition of solid waste processing would not include the extraction of materials from solid waste through advanced recycling.

The proposed bill exempts facilities from solid waste permitting requirements. Since there are no facilities currently operating in Alaska and the legislation would exempt future work from DEC's Solid Waste program, there is no fiscal impact associated with the proposed legislation for the Division of Environmental Health.
