Analysis

The bill creates a new type of protective order to address workplace violence by adding a new article to Alaska Statute (AS) 18.65. Under the new article 12A, section AS 18.65.875, an employer may file a petition against an individual if the employer believes has committed an act of violence, or threatened violence, against the employer or an employee. Orders issued AS 18.65.875 would be valid for up to six months, and ex-parte orders issued under the new section AS 18.65.877 would be valid for 20 days unless dissolved earlier by the court.

The bill amends AS 18.65.540 requiring the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to maintain the workplace violence protective orders in the central registry of protective orders, and peace officers to take reasonable steps to ensure the orders, modified orders, or dismissed orders are entered into the registry within 24 hours. The DPS will need to make programming changes to the central registry of protective orders once the forms have been created by the court. Contractor support will be needed to make the programming changes.

This bill would result in an increased workload for the Alaska State Troopers associated with serving and enforcing the protective orders, but DPS anticipates the impact can be absorbed with existing resources.
