This bill amends the ability of the legislative council to adopt policies for moving allowances and per diem. The bill also requires the State Officers Compensation Commission (SOCC) to adopt pay for the Governor, Lt. Governor, agency heads, and the legislature to attract talented and capable leaders. This bill deletes the provision that the SOCC can meet every year and instead changes it to two years. It also changes the timeframe in which the report must be transmitted to the legislature and the final recommendations are made. Finally, it includes language that the 60 day rejection requirement for the report does not extend if an amended report is submitted. Under AS 39.23.530 the division serves as staff to the commission, and the Division believes they can absorb these costs within their existing budget.
