Analysis

This legislation amends AS 11.81.670 adding a new section that prohibits a peace officer from knowingly using a restraint that impedes another person's breathing or circulation of blood that will produce a loss of consciousness except in situations where deadly force is authorized by law.

This legislation will have no impact to the training of correctional and probation officer within the Department of Corrections as the curricula for mechanical neck restraints is not taught within the officer training curricula; therefore, there is no anticipated fiscal impact from this legislation.
