FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. SB106

Analysis

This bill provides limited opportunity for caregivers who otherwise have a legal duty to support an individual to be paid to provide personal care through Alaska’s Community First Choice (CFC) program. It will help seniors and individuals with disabilities get the personal care services when continued workforce shortages might otherwise prevent them from being able to do so. The Division of Senior and Disabilities Services would approve these services and claims would be funded through Medicaid Services. Regulations would need to be amended to enact this bill. This flexibility is currently allowed during the Public Health Emergency. The bill is not expected to result in a significant increased cost in Medicaid Service, therefore, this is a zero-dollar fiscal note.
