



Legislative Council COVID-19 Mitigation Policy Amended April 18, 2023

Based on Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidance, all legislative facilities remain open to the public under the following protocols:

I. Positive Test/Close Contact

The Legislature will follow current CDC guidance for individuals who test positive or are a close contact of a person who tests positive for COVID.

II. Face Coverings/Masks

Face coverings/masks are **optional** in all legislative facilities with the following exceptions:

1. An individual legislator may require masks in their legislative office(s).
2. A legislative information office (LIO) may require masks to be worn during the delivery of in-person services.
3. Other requests not covered by (1) and (2) will be considered by the Legislative Council Chair or designee.

If a person declines to wear a mask or face covering because of a medical condition or disability as described above, this policy does not require them to produce medical documentation; however, legislators and legislative employees must work through the confidential Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accommodation process with Personnel.
